### 1. Things to talk about from the last meeting




### Day service meals

Carers asked about expenses at the last Partnership Board meeting.


This hasn't been sorted out yet.

The Partnership Board report on 'Transitions for Young People and Health and Social Care Needs' is being written.


Stephen will take the report to the Health Partnership Board.

It was a good meeting but not many people went.




They talked about what things are important.

### 4. Valuing Employment Now regional launch



Paul Wilson talked about the Valuing Employment Now launch held in Wigan.



Valuing Employment Now is part of Valuing People Now.

Valuing People Now says what the Government wants to see happen to make sure people with learning disabilities have good lives.

The main things from Valuing People Now are:

- People having more choice and control
- What people do in the days and evenings, including work
- People being healthy and getting a good service from the NHS

 People having more choice about where they live



Valuing Employment Now is the government's plan and advice about helping even more people with a learning disability get a job if they want one.

At the launch they said:

- Less than 8 in every 100
   people in England with a
   learning disability have a job
- 65 in every 100 people with a learning disability say they want some sort of work every week
- Valuing Employment Now wants more people with moderate and severe learning disability to have paid work.
   It is going to check every year how this is going.

# PARTICIPATION CONTINUES CO

### There are 4 big goals:

- People need to aim higher in schools. People should have ambitions and everyone should get work experience in Year 10 at school.
- College should give people the skills for work and help people to move into work
- Personal budgets should be used more to help people move into work
- More people should have jobs in the public sector



There will be an information pack to help people.



To make these things happen we need lots of people to work better together, including Local Strategic Partnerships, Chief Executives, Social Services departments, CDL, schools and learning providers.




To meet the national target means finding 45,000 jobs.

This training was done with a lead doctor, nurse and practice manager from each doctors surgery. The training was developed with PCTs and Adult Social Care teams in East Lancashire.




Cath Cook talked about service user health action plans.


Lori talked about a transitions event on 21 January at Jan's Conference Centre.
