James, Mandy and 2 other people went to the Blackpool conference.




They learnt about Valuing People Now and how Partnership Boards work.

Peter Soothill, Yasmin Khalil and Alison Westwood will have a meeting to talk about this.




Yasmin asked a question on behalf of Lori.

The 'passport to housing' scheme gives young people training to help them get a house and live there.




We need to make sure that people with a learning disability know about all the different housing services.

We need to see if the right people are coming to the meetings.


A group of people are going to have a meeting to think about this.

The housing group is in the Local Strategic Partnership.



We need a learning disability champion or disability champion at the Council.



We could ask the chairs of the 8 Local Strategic Partnership sub-groups to come to these meetings

Age Concern are doing a report for people with a learning disability.



Council officers at this meeting could help us link up with the Local Strategic Partnership.
