She gets scared to go places and wants to go home. She didn't have a chance to say what she felt.

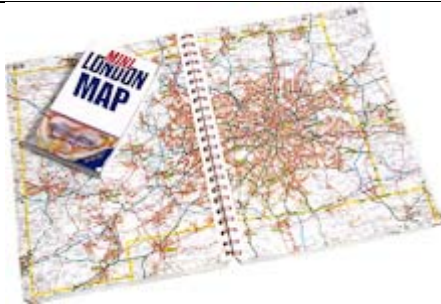


Dorothy said it can take a long time for some people to say what they are feeling.

3. Social enterprise



Stephen Sloss said that the Council is seeing if there are better ways to run social care and help save money.

The Government isn't giving the Council as much money to spend, so we need to think how we can save money.

One idea is to set up a company called a 'not for profit social enterprise'. This means any money that the business makes is used to make the business better.



The Council is running a 'tender'. This means that any business that is interested in running the service, fills in an application form to say why they would be the best people to run the service.

The Council will look at everyone's application forms and choose the best one.



Dorothy said she is not happy with what the Council is doing.

She would like her son to have a personal budget so they can make their own choices about his care.

Dorothy said they could do their own assessment and would spend the money wisely.



Nigel asked why has another parent has got a personal budget for their son, when they don't have a personal budget for their son?



Gill said her son's personal budget was very important to him and their family.



Peter Soothill said that people are being offered personal budgets in stages.

People that live in supported tenancies will be offered a personal budget at a later date.




We should talk about personalisation and personal health budgets at our next meeting.
